General Budget Plan Strategic Planning

The Bath CSD **STRATEGIC PLAN** is developed around five critical focus areas: *Health and Safety, Balanced Instruction, Fiscal Responsibility, Community Connections, and Facilities Optimization.*

All budgetary decisions are driven by this STRATEGIC PLAN



General Budget Plan

Budget Includes:

A rise in levels of spending for employee contractual requirements. These requirements include *salary and health benefits*, as well as adjustments for state mandated *minimum wage* increases.



Following two years of Federal Stimulus Funds (ARPA/CRSSA), the District has begun returning some positions to the general fund which will be reflected in the growth of the budget. However, these are not new positions and this is simply a strategic plan to keep taxes flat during recent COVID years AND a way of placing temporary positions in place to support student growth from missed learning.



General Budget Plan



Budget Includes:

\$100k "Capital Outlay Project" for work on the facilities, which qualifies for approximately 92% state aid reimbursement in the following school year!

Work to Include:

• Replacement of hot water heaters, pumps, and associated piping and infrastructure. These pumps have continued to fail and will require replacement in the near future to maintain operations. This work is included in the 2023-2024 budget proposition and must be completed prior to June 30, 2024 to be eligible for aid the following school year.

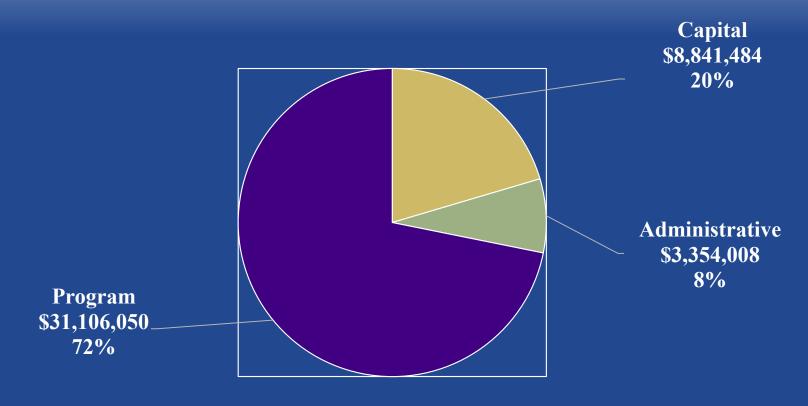

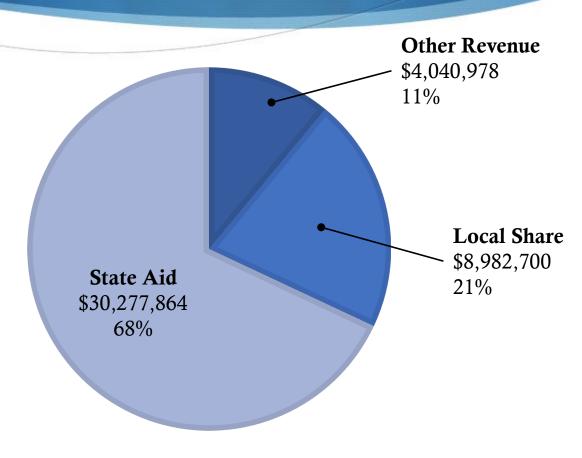

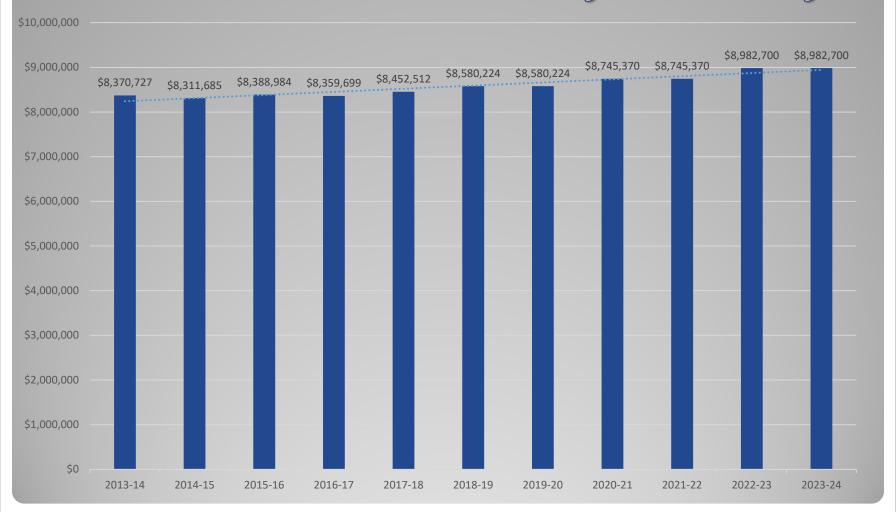
Property Tax Levy

Proposed 2023-2024 Tax Levy = \$8,982,700

- This is an increase of **0.0%** and meets the requirements for the NYS property tax cap law. The District Property Tax Cap is 3.71% for this school year. However, the Board of Education has elected to **NOT** seek any tax increase this year.
- This proposed tax levy is also below the NYS tax levy limit and requires only a simple majority vote (50% +1)
- Over the past 10 years, the Board of Education has minimized any tax levy increases to an average of 0.73% per year

Property Tax Levy = 21% of Total Revenue

Property Tax Bill Calculation

- Tax Levy (Bath CSD)
- Total Market Value of the School District (NYS)
- Tax Rate (Tax Levy/Total Market Value per 1,000)
- Property Assessment (Local Assessor)

Property Tax Bill = Tax Rate x Property Assessment per 1,000



Property Tax Bill Calculation Hypothetical Example

Year 1

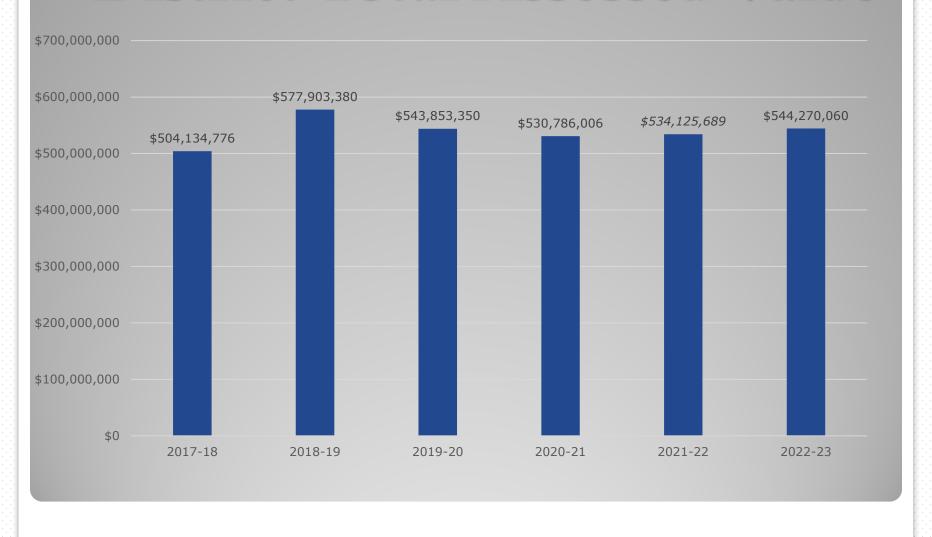
- 1) Tax Levy = \$8,982,700 (set by School District)
- 2) Total Market Value = \$500,000,000
- 3) Tax Rate = \$8,982,700/(\$500,000,000/1000) = \$17.97
- 4) Property Assessment = \$150,000 (by Assessor)
- 5) Property Tax Bill = $$17.97 \times ($150,000/1000) = $2,695.50$

Year 2

- 1) Tax Levy = \$8,982,700
- 2) Total Market Value = \$550,000,000 (10% increase)
- 3) Tax Rate = \$8,982,700/(\$550,000,000/1000) = \$16.33 (9% decrease)
- 4) Property Assessment = \$180,000 (20% increase)
- 5) Property Tax Bill = $16.33 \times (180,000/1000) = 2,939.40 (9\% increase)$

What If?

Rejection of budget would result in a **Contingency Budget**

- Only fund "Ordinary Contingent Expenses" including:
 - Salaries & Benefits
 - Legal Obligations
 - Expenditures Authorized by Statue
- Capital Expenditures, Nonessential Maintenance, and Public Use of School Buildings and Grounds are NOT considered Ordinary Contingent Expenses.
- Tax Levy would still remain flat



School Bus Purchase



BUDGET INCLUDES:

- Up to Two (2) Full-Size 70-Passenger Buses not to exceed \$339,101, less tradein values.
- Eligible for approximately 90% NYS Transportation Aid to reimburse for this purchase



Capital Reserve



BUDGET INCLUDES:

- Establishment of NEW
 Capital Reserve to be funded up to \$10,000,000 over the next ten years.
- This is funded for future projects and only if funds are available each year.

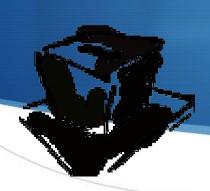
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
